B. Director's Report- Ed Longfield

- 1. Mr. Longfield highlighted the facility repairs that have been completed in the last year. Mr. Abbot has attended city council meetings, worked with HVAC, repaired buildings (paint, tile, carpet, etc) and other projects.
- 2. Building principals presented what they did during the staff inservice days. Mr. Chapman reviewed the items reviewed with staff prior to break. Instructional strategies and best practices of learning and for learning. Strategies and knowledge set up for future inservice dates on learning targets. Mrs. Bettencourt reviewed formative and summative assessments in their gradebooks. How and when the teacher's should assess. All of this ties in to teacher evaluation and students being part of the process is a distinguished teacher. It impacts the rigor in the classroom and allows the students to do a lot of the learning. Mrs. DeNinno reviewed the MS plan. Team building as a 6-12 campus and as a 6-8 group. Looked at end statements with teachers. MS teachers were part of the training already reviewed. She also reviewed the process of rearranging the SPED services.
- 3. December 18 teacher work day. Mrs. McKeever reviewed the tasks that were gone over. Jan 2nd coffee truck and breakfast. Introducing the Social Emotional Program Ruler. Went over goals and expectations for the remainder of the year. RTI process was reviewed. Went over how to raise scores and support end statements. Collaborated on family nights. The SESTA department trained staff on behavior training. Specialist teachers met to work on the elective process. Focus on end statement 3 (culture and climate). Mrs. Waterman implemented a culture building activity, "huddle" to the 3-5 teachers. A way to build climate and culture.

- 4. Mr. Longield reviewed that his focus with his cabinet is to build leadership capacity. Dialogue and conversation about how to build capacity in our leadership.
- 5. Mr. Burk reviewed prioritizing, researching, program and curriculum needs K-12.
