Successes:

IACS scored at or above the state average on ELA ISAT in 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. IACS scored at or above the state average on math ISAT in 8th grade. IACS scored at or above the state average on science ISAT in 8th and 11th grades. The college and career goal was met.

Areas of Challenge:

The K-2 IRI scores did not meet the performance targets. The Math ISAT scores were below state averages in all grades other than 8th.

Plans:

This year IACS has restructured from a 2 principal model (K-5 and 6-12) to a 4 principal model (K-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12). This will allow the building leaders to focus on instructional leadership in smaller teams. Each building has an assistant principal and an instructional coach. A director of academics and arts position was also added to support the building leaders.

Both campuses are continuing to work collaboratively and build upon the PLC process from last school year.

IACS used a literacy grant to purchase many new materials, mostly for K-5, but also supplemental materials for the 6-12 ELA teachers.

IACS purchased the Ready Math program to use K-5. All K-5 classrooms also have a spiraled math program that teachers use in their classrooms on a daily basis to review grade level content. The regional math center will be supporting our efforts to move our math programs forward K-12.
