I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Board President Kaylene McDonald called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. CONSENT ITEMS (Action)

Motion to approve Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded and approved. None opposed.

III. INFORMATION/REPORTS

A. Director's Report- Ed Longfield

- 1. Mr. Longfield addressed end statements one (scores), two (arts), three (culture). He will present data in February again after some interim testing and finals at the secondary campus. Mr. Longfield presented the iReady (Math) data from K-5. Fall and winter scores were compared and compared growth at each grade level. Good growth and teachers have interventions for those that need them. Mr. Longfield reviewed iStation (Reading) data from the fall and winter. Good growth at each grade level. Red level is decreasing and Green is increasing. Growth is important. IACS K-5 is making good progress. End statement one is to outperform the state on assessments. Making good progress in ELA for this goal.
- 2. Mr. Longfield reviewed 5 years of ISAT data. Red line is a goal of 60% proficiency. Blue is IACS and green is the state. ELA is a stronger performer than math for IACS. Reviewed each grade level 3-8 and highschool in ELA and Math. The school is focusing on math as it is an area of concern across all grade levels. High school ISAT data ELA is strong and Math is below the state average. The ISATs changed to 11th grade test in 2022-2023 and not all students took the assessment. In 2023-2024 all 11th graders will take the ISAT.
- 3. SAT data for 2023 was reviewed. SAT going forward is an optional assessment so this will probably be the last year of all students taking it unless they all OPT IN.
- 4. Mr. Mattravers stated we can see improvement. He asked if we are satisfied with the progress being made. Intermediate principal Rob O'Neal stated that he is happy with the progress that is being made and the rate of growth is sufficient and data shows that we are improving. Middle School Principal Lauren DeNinno stated that in the long haul we are headed in the right direction. High School principal, Ken Chapman, stated that he is hopeful in what we are doing with his plan around instructional practice, planning, grading, etc to see the impact it will have over the years.
- 5. Mr. Lonfgield told the board that the administration is working on systems that will help us sustain changes. We have a lot of holes that we need to fill. It will take time but it is in our 3 year

- plan. Mr. Longfield stated the transient nature of what we see in education and we have to figure out a way to stop the revolving door and assess the kids that are here. Lots of mobility in the world.
- 6. Dr. Marie McGrath, Director of Phoenix Connect, presented how Phoenix Connect is supporting end statement one and how the after school programs are supporting our academics. Spanish class is popular. Board Game and Chess club. Generation Pound is a rhythm movement class supporting early literacy skills. Book clubs at both campuses and using the element of literature. Cheerleading is popular at the secondary campus. Parenting class is wrapping up with 20 parents participating in the class on parenting Neurodivergent children. Submitted a grant proposal for \$20,000 to support our book bin program.

IV. ACTION ITEMS

1. Amy Blanes presented the financials for the month of November. We have received 62% of our state funding for the school year. It is based on November ISEE data. We were at 95% attendance. The enrollment and attendance issue is across the board in Idaho. We are currently at a 1:0 debt service ratio. We are monitoring our expenses and reducing expenditures. Still looking at capital expenditures that can be moved. Legislature will be in session soon and education finance is a top topic. Amy reported the legislature is looking at a possible general fund increase, distributing additional funds, modernizing the funding modules, increasing transportation funding, and increasing SPED funding. It is reported that 37 % of students in the state are considered special education. Amy reviewed the proposed budget from the Idaho School Board Association. Board President, Kaylene McDonald, asked if we have been able to identify and move any capital expenditures. Amy Blanes reported not at this time.
